### If Only...

We all have our own 'if only's'. If only my hand didn't shake. If only my knees were stronger. If only I weren't afraid. If only we had enough rain. If only I didn't feel trapped.

God understands. Even though life is not perfect, and even though our property and bodies deteriorate, God promises a restoration of all that is beautiful, all that is good. The struggles of this life cause us to yearn for another, more glorious life.

Isaiah prophesies a day when God's glory will come. 'Here is your God,' Isaiah says. 'God comes to save you.' These words brought hope to those in exile, a people powerless and poor.

When Christians hear this text, we hear a promise that echoes all the way to the birth of Jesus. Jesus, whose name means Saviour, is coming, and all will be made new in him.

Every time we strengthen the weak, help the needy, water the plants or shovel the snow, we remove someone's 'if only'. Eyes are opened. We help people witness the coming of Christ.

**Entrance Antiphon:** Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.

**Gospel Acclamation:** Alleluia, alleluia! The spirit of the Lord has been given to me. He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor. Alleluia!

**Communion Antiphon:** Say to the faint of heart: Be strong and do not fear. Behold, our God will come, and he will save us.

**Sunday 11 December 2016: 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent (Year A)**

**Today, 11 December**, is the Third Sunday of Advent (Year A).

*There is a second collection at this weekend's Masses for Father Hudson's Care.*

Today we hear how John the Baptist continues his central role as the prophetic figure whose life and ministry point the way to Jesus. The optional rose vestments and the rose candle on the Advent Wreath announce that the season of waiting is nearing its end. This is one of the Sundays that used to be identified by the first Latin word of its entrance antiphon, and hence the first word of the day's Mass: *Rejoice!* Some people still call it Gaudete Sunday.

**Tuesday 13 December: St Lucy, Virgin & Martyr**

Lucy suffered martyrdom at Syracuse, probably during the persecution of Diocletian. Her name, meaning 'light', makes her a perfect Advent saint. Christian art depicts her holding her eyes. According to one legend her tormentors removed her eyes. Devotion to her spread almost throughout the whole Church and dates back to the earliest times.

**Wednesday 14 December: St John of the Cross**

St John of the Cross, born at Fontiveros in Old Castile (Spain) about the year 1542, was a Carmelite friar, mystic and poet. A Carmelite reformer, he befriended St Teresa of Avila. He was outstanding in holiness and knowledge, as his many spiritual writings testify.

**Friday 16 December: Rosary at 7pm**

Each Friday evening at 7pm, the Holy Rosary is recited in the church. All are welcome.

*Remember*—Advent season is about trusting and waiting like Mary, and with Mary. The liturgical year begins with Advent, the joyful expectation of Someone, of the Coming One, Emmanuel, God with us. A God who enters history to experience all its stages and share the anxieties, joys, sorrows, hopes and concerns of men and women of all history and of all peoples. Jesus became one of us to give us divine life.
