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### The Great Commandment

There is a great need for more charity in the world. In our material age there is a great tendency for each one to get what he can out of life: money, pleasure, honours. We are so individualistic-minded. We can be selfish. We need charity towards all people. Christ died for all, and we must be willing to go out of our way to be especially kind rather than prejudiced.

Love has many wonderful effects. It increases our energy for good. It gives strength to overcome obstacles. Love makes us joyful, cheerful. Everything we do out of love seems light, for love is our strength, our joy and peace.

Christ emphasizes that we should always be on good terms with our neighbour, with everyone.

We should follow Christ's advice, 'If you bring your gift to the altar [if you are at prayer or about to attend Holy Mass] and there recall that your brother has anything against you, leave your gift at the altar and be reconciled with him [make up, apologize].'

Without charity there is no prayer. St John says, 'If anyone says, "I love God", and hates his brother, he lies.'

The Great Commandment is *Love*.

**Entrance Antiphon:** Be my protector, O God, a mighty stronghold to save me. For you are my rock, my stronghold! Lead me, guide me, for the sake of your name.

**Gospel Acclamation:** Alleluia, alleluia! Speak, Lord, your servant is listening: you have the message of eternal life. Alleluia!

**Today, 12 February**, is the 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A).

This Sunday we will celebrate *World Day of Prayer for the Sick*.

This day was established by Pope St John Paul II in 1992. It is 'a special time of prayer and sharing, of offering one's suffering for the good of the Church, and of reminding us to see in our sick brothers and sisters the face of Christ, who by suffering, dying and rising, achieved the salvation of mankind'.

To celebrate this Day of Prayer for the Sick, I invite the parish community to attend devotions and Benediction this afternoon at 3 o'clock. During these devotions we shall celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick.

## Weddings 2017

If you are planning to get married this year (2017), please contact Br Gordon as soon as possible to make the necessary arrangements.

The Diocese requires at least six months notice, which is essential in cases where the marriage is taking place abroad, when a good deal of administrative work has to be completed. Marriage preparation is also a requirement, whether or not both partners are Catholic.



## Gift Aid

We have been asked to remind all Gift Aid donors to inform the Parish Gift Aid Organiser, James Martin, of any change of address or tax situation in order that accurate records may be kept. Such an update may be emailed or posted to the address in the letter accompanying the annual envelope supply.

The Parish is very grateful to every parishioner who has been able to join the Gift Aid scheme, which enhances each gift by 25% without further expenditure as this is recoverable from HM Revenue and Customs.

Any taxpayer who is interested in joining the scheme should contact James Martin as above. The procedure involves only filling in a simple form of declaration.



## Christ is Present in the Eucharist

It is highly fitting that Christ should have wanted to remain with his Church in this unique way. Since Christ was about to take his departure from his own in his visible form, he wanted to give us his sacramental presence; since he was about to offer himself on the Cross to save us, he wanted us to have the memorial of the love with which he loved us to the end—even to the giving of his life. In his Eucharistic presence he remains mysteriously in our midst as the one who loved us and gave himself up for us, and he remains under signs that express and communicate this love.

## Think about it!

Through the Anointing of the Sick, Jesus fortifies the sick person's soul with more grace and with the strength to resist temptations. Often temptations are stronger when one is physically weak. Jesus gives the sick person comfort to bear his or her sufferings bravely, and courage and consolation in the face of death. He cleanses the soul of venial sin and removes mortal sin. Even forgotten ones, if the person wants forgiveness and is unable to make a confession.

The Lord remits at least some of the temporal punishment due to sin.
