### The Ascension of the Lord


We have many ways of saying goodbye: 'So long'; 'See you later'; 'Take care'.

Goodbyes are softened by the promise of another meeting: 'Till we meet again.' The time until the reunion is filled with both joyful hope and anxious waiting.

Jesus' goodbye came with two promises. He promised the Holy Spirit would guide the disciples in his absence, and he promised that he would come again. That left the disciples in an in-between kind of time. After the goodbye, they waited for his coming again.

In fact, that's where we are, too. We are 'in between' the visits of Jesus, a time of hope and anxiety. We often wonder if we have the tools we need to survive. We need vision and companionship on life's long road.

We have at our disposal the first promise of Jesus, the gift of the Holy Spirit. That Spirit will guide us through times of loneliness, into good decisions, amid the sorrows of sad goodbyes. The Spirit is our centre.

**Church Cleaning:**

**Wednesday 31 May: The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary**

The origins of this feast are rooted in the Franciscan charism of peace and reconciliation. St Bonaventure introduced it into that order's calendar in the thirteenth century. It was extended in 1389 to the entire Western Church as a liturgical observance of prayer to heal the division affecting the Church in that age.

**Also on Wednesday: Padre Pio Prayer Meeting**

The Padre Pio Prayer Group will meet on Wednesday 31 May at 7pm in the Friary Chapel. Rosary, Mass and intercessory prayer to Padre Pio. All are welcome to join us. 'You must have boundless faith in the divine goodness, for victory is absolutely certain.' (St Padre Pio)

**Thursday 1 June: St Justin, Martyr**

St Justin defended the faith in his *Apologies* and *Dialogue*, but his earnestness gained him enemies and he suffered martyrdom in one of the early persecutions of Christians in Rome in 165. He is frequently quoted in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, notably for a description of the early Eucharist.

**Friday 2 June: St Felix of Nicosia, Capuchin Brother**

Born at Nicosia in Sicily in 1715, Felix joined the Capuchin Franciscans and for more than thirty years he exercised the office of quaestor, collecting alms to support the friars and their works of charity. Noted for his humility and simplicity, he was adviser, guide and support for the poor, the learned and the clergy alike. He died in 1787.

**Also on Friday: Holy Rosary & First Friday Mass**

On Friday evening we have Holy Rosary in the church at 7pm. Since it is the first Friday of the month, Mass in honour of the Sacred Heart of Jesus will follow at 7.30pm, followed by prayer and anointing for healing.

**Saturday 3 June: St Charles Lwanga & Companions**

One of twenty-two Ugandan martyrs, Charles Lwanga is patron of youth and Catholic action in most of Africa. He protected his fellow pages (aged 13 to 30) from the demands of the Bagandan ruler, Mwanga, and encouraged and instructed them in the Catholic faith during their imprisonment for refusing the ruler's demands. Charles was burned to death in 1886. Before his martyrdom, Charles encouraged his friends to remain faithful to God.
