Letting the Word Speak to Us

We cannot live without water. It comes from the heavens and waters the earth. The earth then brings forth crops, which produce seed, which enables preparation for other essential foods. Water returns to the heavens, the prophet Isaiah says, but only after it has done its job.

We cannot live without the word of God. It has a job to do as well. It comes from the heavens to bring its fruitfulness to the earth. It announces God's love, provides direction for the wayward, and gives hope to those who despair. God's word returns to heaven, but not before it has done its job.

Sometimes we squander these gifts. Household plants may be inches away from water, but they cannot grow unless we give them a drink. We may be inches away from God's word. It comes to us in the Scriptures, in the order of nature, in the counsel of friends and in the community of believers. But we cannot grow unless we lift the cup and take a drink.

Where does God's word speak around you? What occasions do you have to listen? God's word has a job to do. Put it to work.

Monday 17 July: Blessed John Sugar & Robert Grissold, Martyrs

John Sugar studied at the English College in Douai and was ordained a priest in 1601. After returning to England, he travelled throughout Warwickshire, Staffordshire and Worcestershire to minister to Catholics. Robert Grissold accompanied Fr John Sugar, and one day, while returning after celebrating Holy Mass, they encountered a search party and were arrested. They were martyred for their faith. St Pope John Paul II beatified them in 1987.

Friday 21 July: St Lawrence of Brindisi, Capuchin Priest

Lawrence joined the Capuchin Order at the age of 16 and quickly revealed an ability for theology, philosophy and languages. As a renowned preacher he travelled throughout Europe and wrote many works to explain the Catholic Faith. He died in Portugal as Minister-General of the Order in 1619. He is a doctor of the Church.

Also on Friday: Holy Rosary

Every Friday evening the Holy Rosary is recited in the church at 7pm. All are welcome to attend.

Saturday 22 July: St Mary Magdalen

She was one of the few who remained with Christ during his agony on the Cross. With two other women she went to the tomb and found it empty. It was to her that Our Lord first appeared after his resurrection. He asked her to announce the resurrection to the apostles.

Also on Saturday 22 July: New Altar Servers' Meeting (10am)

The new altar servers are asked to meet next Saturday in the church at 10am. The meeting will last for about half an hour.

Looking further ahead:

29-30 July: The Statue of Our Lady of Fatima

The National Pilgrimage statue of Our Lady of Fatima will be visiting St Chad's Cathedral in Birmingham on 29-30 July. This is the centenary year of the apparitions. Archbishop Bernard will welcome the statue at the 4.30pm Mass on Saturday 29th, at which the statue of Our Lady will be crowned and enthroned. Afterwards there will be an opportunity to venerate relics of the recently canonised 'Little Shepherds of Fatima', Saints Francisco and Jacinta. More information will be available nearer the time.

Interested in becoming Catholic?

Each year the parish runs a course from October to April for adults who have not been

baptized and would like to be, as well as for Christians of other denominations who would like to be received into the Roman Catholic Church, and for baptized Catholic adults who have not received the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist or Confirmation. The course is known as the RCIA (which stands for 'Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults'). Registration forms are available at the back of church.

Remember—Morning Mass is celebrated on every weekday (Monday–Friday at 7.30am & Saturday at 8am). We gather to celebrate, not in the church but in the Friary Chapel. For morning Mass, please enter via the main door of the Friary at 182 Iffley Road. Once in the porch, follow the sign to the Chapel.
