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Transformation in Christ

The Transfiguration tells us that we can be transformed, every day, as we embrace God's word on the mountain: 'This is my beloved Son... Listen to him.' (Matthew 17:5). As we quiet our hearts to hear Jesus' voice, his glory rubs off on us. His word changes our hearts. His glory helps us lift up our heads.

What a wonderful hope this message of transformation is! Without it, we're stuck right where we are. The best we can do is what Peter stammered out: erect a tent to honour what God has done for us.

Of course, commemorating past blessings isn't a bad thing, but God has so much more for us. He wants us to move into the future with him. He invites us to follow him on his journey of love, through the cross to the risen life that he has promised to all of us.

So listen to Jesus today. Try to detect his still voice in prayer, in nature, or in your circumstances. Listen to him, and he will raise you up.

Tuesday 8 August: St Dominic

Born at Calaruega in Spain about the year 1170, Dominic founded the Order of Preachers (Dominicans), devoted to contemplation, study and preaching. A contemporary of St Francis of Assisi, he died on 6 August 1221 at Bologna.

Wednesday 9 August: St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. Feast.

This feast commemorates a heroine of modern-day persecution, Edith Stein (1891-1942). She was born into an orthodox Jewish family. She became a philosopher and spiritual writer. She became a Catholic in 1922 and entered a Carmelite convent in 1934, taking the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross.

When the Nazis began persecuting the Jews she left for the Netherlands to protect the nuns in her convent. However, the Nazis invaded Holland and she was arrested, taken to Auschwitz, and gassed in 1942. Pope St John Paul II named her co-patron of Europe.

Thursday 10 August: St Lawrence, Deacon & Martyr

One of the most influential martyrs of the early Church, this deacon is the subject of countless works of art and the patron of more churches in Rome than any other saint except the blessed Mother of God, Mary. Lawrence is remembered for his extraordinary charity to the poor and hungry, as well as his bravery when roasted to death on a grill, just a few days after the martyrdom of the pope he served.

Friday 11 August: St Clare

A close friend of St Francis of Assisi, Clare lived in the same town and heard him preach in the streets. She approached him secretly (for she was from a noble family) and told him of her desire to follow him and live for God. She founded the Order of Poor Ladies (Poor Clares) at San Damiano and led that community for 40 years, devoted to poverty, a life of prayer and silence.

Interested in becoming Catholic?

Each year the parish runs a course from October to April for adults who have not been baptized and would like to be, as well as for Christians of other denominations who would like to be received into the Roman Catholic Church, and for baptized Catholic adults who have not received the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist or Confirmation. The course is known as the RCIA (which stands for ‘Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults’). Registration forms are available at the back of church.

Through the Eucharist we deepen our unity with Christ.

Jesus wants to teach all of us. He wants to draw us to himself. Through the Holy Spirit he wants to give us insights into God’s wisdom and love and grace so that we can take on the ‘mind of God’. This happens in a special and powerful way at Mass. As bread is transformed into the Body of Christ, our eyes can be opened to see Jesus. As his body is broken and shared with us, our hearts can be filled with his love and mercy, and that moves us to want to serve.

Morning Mass is celebrated on every weekday (Monday–Friday at 7.30am & Saturday at 8am) in the Friary Chapel. For morning Mass, please enter via the main door of the Friary at 182 Iffley Road. Once in the porch, follow the sign to the Chapel.
