A Still, Small Voice

There's a phrase insurance companies use for a natural disaster: an 'act of God'. It's a little unfair to libel God as the originator of deeds of destruction. Even so, when the forces of nature reveal their strength, people become aware of their weakness and meditate on the power of God.

When Elijah fled the murderous Queen Jezebel, he eventually found himself in a cave on the mountain of God, Horeb. There he witnessed God passing by. Not in the strong wind, or an earthquake or fire, but he beheld God's presence in a tiny whispering sound.

Noise fills much of our day. The radio or television breaks the morning silence. Background music filters through stores.

It may not take an 'act of God' for us to be able to find God. It may just take a quiet space.

Monday 14 August: St Maximilian Kolbe, Franciscan Priest & Martyr

Born in Poland in 1894, he entered the Franciscan Order and was ordained priest in Rome in 1918. He had a great love for the Blessed Virgin Mary. He was founder of the Militia of Mary Immaculate. He was imprisoned at Auschwitz during World War II, where he gave up his life so that a fellow prisoner, a father of children, could live. He died by a lethal injection of carbolic acid given him by guards.

Tuesday 15 August: The Assumption of the Virgin Mary into Heaven.

This day is *a Holy Day of Obligation*.

Today the Church celebrates Mary's welcome into heaven. As we believe that Jesus was the first to rise from the dead, so we believe he has also received his mother into eternity.

Pope Pius XII declared the bodily assumption of Mary into heaven a dogma of the Church in 1950.

Dogmatic Definition of the Assumption of the Virgin Mary:

"Therefore, having directed humble and repeated prayers to God, and having invoked the light of the Spirit of Truth; to the glory of almighty God who has bestowed his special bounty on the Virgin Mary, for the honour of his Son the immortal King of ages and victor over sin and death, for the greater glory of his august mother, and for the joy and exultation of the whole Church; by the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, of the blessed apostles Peter and Paul, and by our own authority, we proclaim, declare and define as a dogma revealed by God: that the Immaculate Mother of God, Mary ever virgin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven." (Pope Pius XII, 1 November 1950)

Interested in becoming Catholic?

Each year the parish runs a course from October to April for adults who have not been baptized and would like to be, as well as for Christians of other denominations who would like to be received into the Roman Catholic Church, and for baptized Catholic adults who have not received the Sacraments of Holy Eucharist or Confirmation. The course is known as the RCIA (which stands for 'Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults'). Registration forms are available at the back of the church.

Weddings 2018

If you are planning to get married next year, please contact Br Gordon as soon as possible to make the necessary arrangements.

The Diocese requires at least six months notice, which is essential in cases where the marriage is taking place abroad, when a good deal of administrative work has to be completed. Marriage preparation is also a requirement, whether or not both partners are Catholic.
