God Sees to the Heart

Even if you live a good life, if you do one thing wrong, people will never let you forget about it. They remind you of your past foolishness. It doesn't seem fair, because you have been so good otherwise.

But God sees to the heart. God knows a person's intent. God knows what a person is responsible for and how sincerely they are trying to do what is right. That's a good thing for us.

It means that if we who are basically good commit some wrong act we can still obtain mercy when we repent. Mercy comes from a God who expects us to change for the better.

Entrance Antiphon: All that you have done to us, O Lord, you have done with true judgement, for we have sinned against you and not obeyed your commandments. But give glory to your name and deal with us according to the bounty of your mercy.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! If anyone loves me he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him. Alleluia!

Monday 2 October: The Guardian Angels

Today's celebration has been on the Calendar since 1670 as a way of proclaiming God's protection for all who are helpless. In the Gospel, Jesus challenges his followers to become 'the little ones', by which Matthew understands not only children, but all who follow Christ and embrace his teaching with the openness and trustfulness of children. God's providential love shelters such seekers. In Jesus' imagery they live under the watchful care of angels who 'continually see the face of God'.

Tuesday 3 October: St Thomas Cantilupe, Bishop (1218-1282)

St Thomas Cantilupe was born of a noble family and educated at Oxford. As a priest he lectured at Oxford University and served two terms as Chancellor of the University. In 1275 he became Bishop of Hereford.

Also on Tuesday: The Transitus, at 7pm

On Tuesday evening we celebrate the *Transitus*—the death of St Francis. The parish community is invited to attend this special celebration at 7pm, in which we commemorate the last moments of St Francis' life, his *transitus* from earthly life into eternity. In it we recall the time leading up to his death and what he said to the Friars who were with him.

If you've never been to the *Transitus* before, come along to this celebration at 7pm. Afterwards, refreshments will be served in the Hall.

Wednesday 4 October: Our Holy Father St Francis of Assisi

On Wednesday 4 October, we celebrate the Solemnity of St Francis of Assisi. Mass will be celebrated at the usual time of 7.30am in the Friary Chapel. There will be a special Mass celebrated at 7pm in the church, at which a Dominican from Blackfriars will preach. Come and celebrate this special Mass with us.

St Francis of Assisi is one of the most beloved saints. The 'little poor man' is known for a life of voluntary poverty. His simple approach to life and his love for God's creation have made him a charismatic figure to every generation.

Thursday 5 October: All Deceased Capuchins

Every year, after the Solemnity of St Francis, each of our fraternities will celebrate a memorial Mass for all the deceased brothers and benefactors.

Friday 6 October: Rosary & First Friday Mass—Sacred Heart

On Friday we celebrate the First Friday Mass at 7.30pm after public recitation of the Rosary at 7pm. The Mass is in honour of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, with prayers and anointing for healing.

First Reconciliation and Holy Communion Programme 2018

Children applying for First Holy Communion need to be in Year Three (seven years old) and their families need to be part of the Greyfriars parish community. The First Holy Communion programme prepares children for the Sacrament of Reconciliation and for First Holy Communion through a series of sessions which will be held on Sunday mornings at 10am in the Friary Chapel. Children are expected to attend one of the Sunday Masses. Registration forms are available at the back of the church.

Confirmation: Register for the 2018 Confirmation Programme

Registration is now open for the 2018 programme, which will start in January. The deadline for registration is the end of November. Candidates need to have finished primary school and be entering, or already in, secondary school.
