Our Lord Jesus Christ, Universal King

There is a great tussle for the minds and hearts of the young throughout the world. They are presented with many choices. Some woo them to total freedom and pleasure through drugs and licence as the road to happiness. 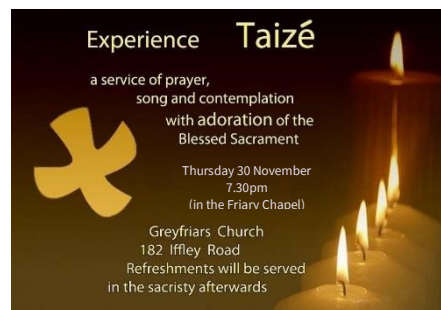
Church Cleaning:

Thursday 30 November: St Andrew, Apostle

Andrew was a fisherman and a disciple of John the Baptist before following Jesus. The Gospel today tells the story of Andrew's call together with his brother Simon Peter. St Paul's letter to the Romans says people will pray only if they believe. They believe only if they hear. They hear only if someone preaches the Good News. Andrew's example inspires us all to proclaim what we have heard and believe.

Thursday 30 November: Taizé Prayer



On the last Thursday of each month you are invited to attend a Taizé prayer service at 7.30pm in the Friary Chapel. Taizé-style worship centres on singing, prayer, and readings from Scripture. Brother Alois from Taizé wrote: 'The exchange with God becomes real for us in prayer; by his Holy Spirit God comes to dwell with us. By his Word and by the Sacraments, Christ gives himself to us. In

return, we can surrender everything to him.'

Friday 1 December: St Edmund Campion, Priest & Martyr

Born in London in 1540, he studied at Oxford. After being reconciled to the Catholic Church, he studied at Douai and then Rome, where he joined the Jesuits. When he returned to England his extraordinary success caused him to be hunted down mercilessly. He was martyred at Tyburn in 1581.

Also on Friday: Rosary at 7pm followed by First Friday Mass

After the weekly recitation of the Holy Rosary, we also celebrate the monthly First Friday Mass at 7.30pm in honour of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, followed by prayers and anointing for healing. All are welcome.

Looking further ahead:

Next Sunday, 3 December: First Sunday of Advent

We begin not only a new liturgical season but also a new liturgical year. It is a time for preparation, extending over four Sundays leading up to Christmas. The name 'Advent' translates the Latin *Adventus*, which comes from the Latin *advenire*, meaning 'to come to, to arrive', and refers to the coming of Christ, to our celebration of his birth at Christmas, to the coming of Christ in our lives through grace and the Sacrament of Holy Communion, and finally to his second coming at the end of time.

Sunday 3 & 10 December: Christmas Collection for the Gatehouse

The Gatehouse, which is attached to St Giles Church and is a drop-in centre and café for the homeless and vulnerably housed, gives a Christmas present to each guest in December, and they are appealing for the following items:

new underpants, socks, hats, gloves, scarves and bars of chocolate.

This year we at Greyfriars will again be collecting for this appeal *on the first two Sundays of Advent, 3 and 10 December*. In deciding what you wish to contribute, please bear in mind that 90% of guests at the Gatehouse are male, and that whilst the underpants should be new, the other clothes could be slightly used but must be clean and of good enough quality to be given as a Christmas gift. Please bring your gifts to the Sacred Heart altar.
