Proclaiming the Lord's Wonders

There are times when you just have to speak up. Something wonderful has delighted you. Or something unjust has befallen you. You have to tell people about it.

Peter and John healed a cripple, then preached a sermon about Jesus. People listened. The authorities grew nervous. So they arrested them. Meanwhile 5000 believers were baptized.

The authorities asked Peter and John for an explanation. They gave a speech about the power of the name of Jesus Christ and the majesty of God who raised him from the dead.

Peter and John had experienced the wonder of God's power and the injustice of their arrest.

When God's power touches us, we have to speak up about it. This Easter God has raised you up to new life in Christ. What wonders have you seen? Who will hear you proclaim them?

Response: **The stone which the builders rejected has become the corner stone.**

2nd Reading: 1 John 3:1-2

Gospel: John 10:11-18

Entrance Antiphon: The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my own sheep and my own know me. Alleluia!

Communion Antiphon: The Good Shepherd has risen, who laid down his life for his sheep and willingly died for his flock, alleluia.

Today is the 4th Sunday of Easter (Year B)

Today is **World Day of Prayer for Vocations** (also known as ‘Good Shepherd Sunday’) and fulfils publicly the Lord’s instruction, “Pray the Lord of the harvest to send labourers into his harvest” (Mt. 9:38; Lk 10:2). Please pray for vocations to the priesthood, diaconate, religious life, societies of apostolic life and secular institutes. May young men and women hear and respond generously to the Lord’s call.

Monday 23 April: St George, Patron of England. Solemnity.

Popular tradition presents St George as a knight. He was the son of an illustrious family of Cappadocia and at a young age was raised to the ministry during the Emperor Diocletian’s reign. When the Emperor promulgated an edict against the Christians, St George professed his faith publicly, for which he was martyred. During the Crusades Richard the Lionheart, impressed by the cult of St George, so popular in the East, made St George the Protector of England.

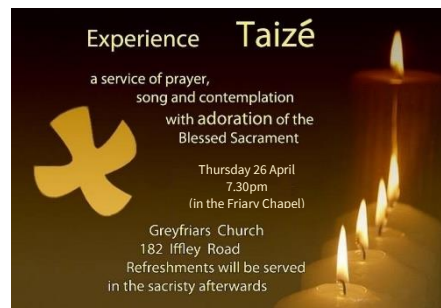
Tuesday 24 April: St Fidelis of Sigmaringen, Capuchin Martyr

Born in 1566 in Germany as Mark Rey and known as the poor man’s lawyer, he became a Capuchin Friar and was given the name Fidelis of Sigmaringen. He accepted a mission to Switzerland and served there despite opposition from Calvinists. He suffered martyrdom at their hands in 1622, during an age of tragic misunderstanding among separated Christians.

Wednesday 25 April: St Mark, Evangelist. Feast.

Mark’s Gospel is thought to have been put together about the time of St Peter’s martyrdom—the early 60s. Mark was in Rome with St Paul and St Peter. His Gospel is based on St Peter’s teaching in Rome. Its direct style tells us something of Mark’s personality. He is Patron Saint of Venice, where his body and relics remain.
