### **Tuesday 1 May: St Joseph the Worker**

After communists and others began to celebrate May Day for workers, Pope Pius XII instituted a memorial of St Joseph the Worker on the same day. It did two things. It affirmed the dignity of work and opposed communism. By recalling St Joseph, the carpenter of Nazareth, the celebration continues to remind those in authority of their duty to respect the dignity and rights of workers, and to encourage workers to persevere in their religious faith.

### **Also on Tuesday 1 May: Bible Study at 7pm**

Are you interested in learning more about Sacred Scripture? Are you looking for spiritual fulfilment outside the Mass? If so, why not join the Bible Study group in the parish?

But why should I study Scripture? First, it is God's Word to us. Studying Scripture not only helps us to learn God's message but also allows us to know God better, to avoid error, to become more Christlike.

### **Wednesday 2 May: St Athanasius, Bishop & Doctor of the Church**

Athanasius, an Egyptian prelate from Alexandria, attended the Council of Nicaea and defended the divinity of Christ against Arius. He was active at the Council which formulated a version of the Creed we recite at Mass today. Strong opposition forced him to spend 46 years of his episcopate in exile.

### **Thursday 3 May: Feast of St Philip & St James, Apostles**

Philip was born at Bethsaida. Formerly a disciple of John the Baptist, he became a follower of Christ. He was crucified at Hierapolis in Phrygia, where he had preached the Gospel. He introduced St Bartholomew to Christ.

James was a cousin of Our Lord. He ruled the church at Jerusalem, wrote the Epistle, and led a life of penance. He converted many, and was martyred in the year 62.

### **Friday 4 May: Feast of the English Martyrs**

This feast celebrates the many men and women who suffered for the Faith in England between 1535 and 1630 and have subsequently been recognized by the Church. Many gave their lives for the unity of the Church, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the supremacy of the Pope. Of these martyrs 42 have now been canonized. Some 160

others have been declared Blessed, and their common celebration is kept on this day. **Also on Friday: Rosary (7pm) followed by First Friday Mass (7.30pm)** Holy Rosary is recited in the church every Friday evening at 7pm. All are welcome. Afterwards, this week, we shall celebrate the monthly First Friday Mass in honour of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, followed by prayers and anointing for healing.
