Saturday 12 May: St Leopold Mandic, Capuchin Priest

Known as ‘Apostle of the Sacrament of Confession’, he was born on 12 May 1866 in Castelnuovo, Dalmatia. Although physically frail, he showed signs of great spiritual strength and integrity. He entered the Capuchin Order and wanted to be a missionary in Eastern Europe, torn apart by religious strife. This was denied him. In 1906 he was sent to Padua and for almost forty years he was a confessor and spiritual director.

Why do we have to go to Mass?

God doesn’t have to love us as a Father; he freely chooses to do so. Nor did he ‘have to’ give us his only Son to die for our sins and grant us the possibility of eternal life. God’s creativity is outdone only by his generosity.

So rather than asking why we should go to Mass, here is the question we should be asking: ‘Is God worth it?’ Is taking one hour a week to worship God, who has blessed us with everything we have, worth it? Is having an hour set aside to let God love us while we try to love him worth it? Do we think created things are more important than the One who created them?

Everything we have is a gift from God—every blessing in our lives, every person, talent, ability and interest—every good gift. The Mass is the greatest gift God gives us. When we come to be more aware of our own sins and our need for a saviour, the more clearly we see the Mass not merely as an obligation but rather as an opportunity not to be missed.
