Being Different

If we are doing God's will, what we are created for—to love him and love our neighbour—we will be different. And that's exactly how Jesus wants it.

St Mark tells us that Jesus himself spoke in riddles and parables to the people around him—he even mystified his closest disciples! This was part of his strategy: to provoke his listeners to think more deeply about God and about their lives. He wanted to awaken in them a hunger for God so that they would come to ask him for more. Then, when they were ready, he could open their hearts to the 'mystery of the Kingdom of God' (Mk 4:11).

So keep being different! Love. Forgive. Pray. Give. Then, when someone asks you why you are the way you are, tell them you're just trying to be like Jesus.

Who knows? You may win them over.

Monday 18 June: Dedication of St Chad's Cathedral

The Cathedral of St Chad in Birmingham was built by Bishop Thomas Walsh, Vicar Apostolic of the Midland District, and designed by Augustus Pugin. The foundation stone was laid on 29 October 1839 and the cathedral was opened and consecrated on 21 June 1841. It was the first Catholic cathedral built in England since the Reformation, and it became the principal church of the Diocese of Birmingham when Pope Pius IX restored the English Hierarchy in 1850. In 1911 St Chad's became a Metropolitan Cathedral when the Province of Birmingham was created by St Pius X with Birmingham as its Archbishopric. The Cathedral was created a Minor Basilica by Pius XII on the occasion of its centenary in 1941.

Thursday 21 June: St Aloysius Gonzaga, Religious (1568-1591)

An Italian of a noble family, Aloysius joined the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) and was praised for his simplicity and piety. During a plague he cared for the sick in hospital. These efforts brought on the sickness that claimed his life at the age of 23.

Friday 22 June: St John Fisher & St Thomas More

John Fisher and Thomas More both became influential in the English royal court and suffered martyrdom during the reign of Henry VIII. When John Fisher was locked in the Tower of London, Pope Paul III made him a Cardinal. Thomas More, a husband and father, an author, and ultimately Lord Chancellor, also denied the King's authority in matters of faith and suffered arrest and martyrdom.

Also on Friday: Holy Rosary at 7pm

Every Friday evening the Holy Rosary is recited in the church at 7pm. All are welcome to attend.

Looking ahead:

Next Sunday, 24 June, we celebrate the Birth of John the Baptist.

Six months before the birth of Jesus we celebrate the birth of John the Baptist. Together with the preceding feasts of the Annunciation and the Visitation, this celebration is part of a complex of feasts throughout the year that are associated with Christmas. As we celebrate John's birth, we recall that he was the prophet of the Most High and would go before the Lord to prepare the way and proclaim salvation through the forgiveness of sin. We too are called to proclaim God's mercy and to prepare a way for him to come into our world.

Also next Sunday, 24 June: Eucharistic Ministers' Commitment

All the parish's Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist are asked to attend the 11am Mass to renew their commitment to this ministry. These lay ministers of the Eucharist assist the priest at Mass in the distribution of Holy Communion. They may also be asked to take Holy Communion to the sick and housebound.
