## Special Birthdays

Since the early Church John the Baptist has been revered as one of the greatest of saints. He is the one who is the precursor of the Word made flesh. Jesus calls him the greatest person born. John's birth is one of three that are honoured and celebrated by the Church. The other two are the birth of the Lord and the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We have always seen in John a model of discipleship and of what it means to make Christ the centre of one's life. In addition to celebrating the birth of John the Baptist, the Church also celebrates his martyrdom—his beheading.

It is no accident that the summer and winter solstices take place just before the Church celebrates the births of John and Christ. On 21 June, the sun's course changes and the natural light begins to decrease. On 21 December, it changes again, and from that point on the light increases.

Groups of dedicated volunteers keep the church clean and tidy. This week is the turn of Group A: Mary Joyce & family. Thank you.

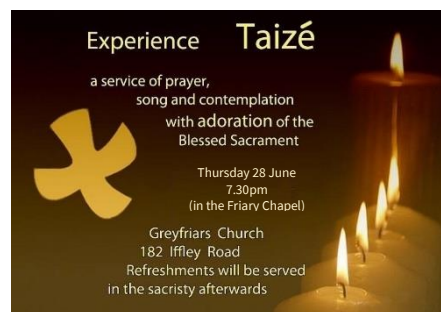
### **Tuesday 26 June: Bible Study Group**

### **Thursday 28 June: St Irenaeus, Bishop & Martyr (c.130-c.200)**

Irenaeus was a disciple of St Polycarp, himself a disciple of John the Apostle. He studied in Rome and became Bishop of Lyons. In his writings he sought to defend the Catholic faith against the errors of the Gnostics. He was martyred about the year 200.

### **Friday 29 June: St Peter & St Paul, Apostles—Holy Day of Obligation**

This Solemnity holds such importance in the church. Tradition holds that on this day Peter and Paul met and embraced before marching off to their deaths—Peter on the Vatican Hill, Paul outside the city of Rome. They suffered at the hands of Nero, who persecuted Christians to distract the population from the sorrows attendant on the Great Fire of Rome (in the year 64). Together these two apostles represent the early evangelization of Jews and Gentiles. This Solemnity is a Holy Day of Obligation.
