Tuesday 28 August: St Augustine

After his conversion at the age of 31, Augustine adopted a monastic lifestyle and within a few years was ordained a priest and then a bishop. His many sermons and writings have been a strong influence in Christianity ever since.

Wednesday 29 August: The Beheading of St John the Baptist

John the Baptist's preaching ministry and eventually his life were brought to an end because he dared to criticise King Herod for marrying his brother's wife, Herodias.

Thursday 30 August: Sts Margaret Clitheroe, Anne Line & Margaret Ward

These three English women died at different times and in different ways. But they were all martyred for aiding and abetting Catholic priests during the reign of Elizabeth I.

Friday 31 August: St Aidan & the Saints of Lindisfarne

The small island of Lindisfarne, off the coast of Northumberland, became the base for St Aidan in his evangelisation of the Anglo-Saxons. After his time the monastery there was home to many other holy men, such as St Coleman, all of whom we commemorate together.
