### Humility

It would be easy to laugh at the disciples for arguing about which of them was the greatest; but most of us are prone to spend time and energy worrying about the same sort of questions: who is more or less important? where am I in the pecking order? how do I compare to others? what do they think of me?

The humble person, however, isn't really interested in these questions. As C.S. Lewis put it, "He will not be thinking about humility: he will not be thinking about himself at all."

Gospel: Mark 9:30-37

#### **Church Cleaning:**

#### **Monday 24 September: Our Lady of Walsingham**

Devotion to Our Lady of Walsingham dates back over one thousand years, and Walsingham is still the national shrine for the Blessed Virgin Mary.

#### **Tuesday 25 September: Bible Study**

This Capuchin priest was a firm and gentle spiritual guide, who emphasised the importance of controlling one's tongue.

Every Friday evening the Holy Rosary is recited in the church at 7pm. All are welcome.

#### **Saturday 29 September: Ss. Michael, Gabriel & Raphael**

We thank God for these archangels who are great defenders and helpers for us. And this is the patronal feast day for Br. Michael of the Greyfriars fraternity.



### *Looking further ahead:*

#### **3 & 4 October: Feast of St. Francis of Assisi**

On the evening of 3 October the Franciscan friars will be commemorating the death of St Francis, and then on 4 October they will celebrate the Mass of his feast. More details in next week's newsletter.

#### **5 October: CAFOD Family Fast Day**

On this Friday we are invited to eat simply – perhaps having a bowl of soup instead of a meal – and give the money we save to the work of CAFOD. There will be a second collection for your offerings on the following weekend, 6-7 October.



#### **Tea/Coffee after the 11am Sunday Mass**

#### **Morning Mass**

Morning Mass is celebrated on every weekday (Monday–Friday at 7.30am & Saturday at 8am) in the Friary Chapel. For morning Mass, please enter via the main door of the Friary at 182 Iffley Road. Once in the porch, follow the sign to the Chapel.

#### **Eucharistic Adoration**

It is a great help to prayer to be in the presence of Jesus in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. You are welcome to join the friars in quietly adoring Him on Saturdays 5.30pm-6.15pm (in the main church) and Mondays to Fridays after the 7.30am Mass until 8.30am (in the Friary Chapel).

#### **Holy Communion for the Housebound**

Often, as we get older, we are not always able to attend Mass and need to receive the Sacrament at home. The priest or a Eucharistic minister normally takes Holy Communion to the housebound at times when it is convenient. Please let Br. Paul know if you or a loved one cannot attend Mass, and he will arrange Holy Communion at home.
