November Prayers for the Dead

Many of those who have died are still being prepared in purgatory for entry into heaven. We pray for them throughout the year, but especially focus on them during the month of November. As one way of doing this together, you're invited to collect a November envelope from the back of the church and place in it the names of your deceased loved ones. These names will be placed under the altar throughout November and Mass will be offered for them every day. If you wish to make an offering, you can also put it in the envelope.

Wednesday 31 October: St Angelo of Acri

An example of perseverance after unpromising starts, Angelo gave up during his first two attempts as a Capuchin novice, but finally made it through on his third attempt in 1690, and was ordained. Unsuccessful in his first sermons, he eventually became a famous preacher after adopting a simpler preaching style backed up by prayer.

Thursday 1 November: ALL SAINTS

On this day we celebrate all the saints in heaven, including all those (the majority) who are not canonised. As part of our training regime to become saints ourselves, it is a holy day of obligation. Masses here at Greyfriars are at 7.30am and 7.30pm.

Friday 2 November: ALL SOULS

Our November prayers for the dead kick-off in earnest on All Souls Day. Although it's not a holy day of obligation, many people like to attend Mass to pray for their departed family and friends. So again Mass will be at 7.30am and 7.30pm. The evening Mass will double as our regular First Friday Mass, so prayers for healing will be available for those who want to stay on at the end.

Also on Friday 2 November: Holy Rosary

Every Friday evening the Holy Rosary is recited in the church at 7pm. All are welcome.

Saturday 3 November: St Martin de Porres

Of mixed race himself, this Dominican lay-brother was known for his unconditional care of all people, regardless of race or wealth. He died in Lima on this day in 1639.
