On this day we celebrate all the holy Franciscans in heaven, whether canonised or not.

Friday 30 November: St Andrew

Andrew was one of the first two disciples to follow Jesus and became one of the Apostles. After missionary work around the Black Sea, he was crucified in Greece.

Every Friday evening the Holy Rosary is recited in the church at 7pm. All are welcome.

Saturday 1 December: St Edmund Campion

Born in 1540, Edmund studied at Oxford before becoming a Catholic and joining the Jesuits. He ministered for only one year in England before being arrested, and he was hung, drawn, and quartered at Tyburn.

Sundays 2 & 9 December: Christmas Collection for the homeless
