1st Reading: 1 Samuel 26:2,7-9,11-13,22-23

Response: **The Lord is compassion and love.**

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 15: 45-49

Gospel: Luke 6: 6:27-38

Entrance Antiphon: O Lord, I trust in your merciful love. My heart will rejoice in your salvation. I will sing to the Lord who has been bountiful with me.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Open our heart, O Lord, to accept the words of your Son. Alleluia!

Communion Antiphon: I will recount all your wonders, I will rejoice in you and be glad, and sing psalms to your name, O Most High.

Continuing today, Sunday 24 February: Alpha Course

Alpha is a series of interactive sessions that freely explore the basic questions about the Christian faith. They are in the church hall at 10am on Sundays, between the 9am and 11am Masses. This week, the question is, “Why and how do I pray?”

This week:

Church Cleaning:

Groups of dedicated volunteers keep the church clean and tidy. This week is the turn of Group D: Norbert & Leonel. Thank you.

Tuesday 26 February: Bible Study

The Bible Study Group meets on Tuesday at 7.30pm in the Friary (182 Iffley Rd). Please read beforehand chapters 10 & 11 of the Acts of the Apostles. The Group provides a place to unfold Scripture: you are welcome to attend, whatever your knowledge of the Bible.

Thursday 28 February: Taizé Prayer

You are invited to attend a Taizé prayer service at 7.30pm in the Friary Chapel. Taizé-style worship centres on singing, prayer, and readings from Scripture. Brother Alois from Taizé wrote: ‘The exchange with God becomes real for us in prayer; by his Holy Spirit God comes to dwell with us. By his Word and by the Sacraments, Christ gives himself to us. In return, we can surrender everything to him.’

Friday 1 March: St David

A Welsh monk who became bishop of Mynwy (now called St Davids) during the sixth century, David is the patron saint of Wales.

Also on Friday 1 March: Holy Rosary, followed by First Friday Mass

Every Friday evening we pray the Holy Rosary in the church at 7pm. This Friday it is followed at 7.30pm by the monthly Mass in honour of the Sacred Heart, which includes prayers for healing. All are welcome.

Saturday 2 March: St Chad

St Bede tells us that Chad, along with his elder brothers, was a pupil of St Aidan at his Lindisfarne school. He was Bishop of York for a while, but gave it up to found a monastery at Lichfield. He is patron saint of our Birmingham Archdiocese.

Looking ahead:

Monday 4 March: Funeral of Ann Leonard

Ann was a regular in this parish until she moved into sheltered accommodation a few years ago. She died on 3 February and her funeral service will be here in Greyfriars Church at 11am on 4 March.
