Continuing today, Sunday 3 March: Alpha Course

Alpha is a series of interactive sessions that freely explore the basic questions about the Christian faith. They are in the church hall at 10am on Sundays, between the 9am and 11am Masses. This week, the question is, “Why and how should I read the Bible?”

Monday 4 March: St Casimir

He was the son of King Casimir IV and Queen Elizabeth, monarchs of Poland and Lithuania. In contrast to other members of the royal court, he was a shining example of faith, piety, humility, and chastity. He is patron saint of Poland.

Also on Monday 4 March: Funeral of Ann Leonard

One of the Nazareth House girls, Ann was a regular in this parish until she moved into sheltered accommodation a few years ago. She died on 3 February and her funeral service will be here in Greyfriars Church at 11am on 4 March.

Also on Monday 4 March: Legion of Mary

At 7.30pm every Monday, a group of people gather to pray and to organise works of mercy. Along with thousands of others around the world, they place themselves under the leadership and protection of Mary, the Mother of God – hence their name, ‘The Legion of Mary’. Wednesday 6 March: Ash Wednesday—the beginning of Lent

The ancient tradition of receiving ashes on our foreheads continues to speak to us. It is a reminder of our mortality and our lowliness, and it is a sign of our intention to change our lives for the better in the run-up to renewing our baptismal promises at Easter. Ashes will be distributed during Mass in the church at 7.30am and 7.30pm.

Friday 8 March: Holy Rosary, followed by Stations of the Cross

Every Friday evening we pray the Holy Rosary in the church at 7pm. All are welcome. And on most Fridays in Lent we will also commemorate the sufferings and death of Jesus with the prayers and reflections of the Stations of the Cross, at 7.30pm.
