Come, Holy Spirit!



Sunday 9 June 2019: Pentecost (Year C)



1st Reading: Acts 2:1-11

Response: **Send forth your spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth.**

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3-7,12-13

Gospel: John 20:19-23

Entrance Antiphon: The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole world and that which contains all things understands what is said, alleluia.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Alleluia!

Communion Antiphon: They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke of the marvels of God, alleluia.

Saturday 8 June (Evening Mass): Confirmations

At the 6.30pm Mass, Bishop William Kenney will administer the sacrament of Confirmation to parishioners who have been preparing over the past several months. We pray that the gifts of the Holy Spirit will be fruitful in them.

Church Cleaning:

Monday 10 June: Mary, Mother of the Church

This is a new celebration, added to the calendar in 2018. It is always on the Monday following Pentecost Sunday, remembering that Mary was there with the disciples when the Holy Spirit came and the Church began its mission.

Also Monday 10 June: Legion of Mary

The Legion of Mary is a small group of ordinary Catholics who gather to pray and to organise works of mercy. If you would like to join a meeting and find out more, come to the door of the sacristy (at the side of the church) at 7.30pm.

Tuesday 11 June: St Barnabas

Like St Paul, Barnabas is counted as an Apostle despite not being one of the Twelve. The two of them carried out what seems to have been the first mission into Gentile territory.

Thursday 13 June: Jesus Christ, Eternal High Priest

Another new feast in the Church's calendar, this reminds us that Jesus has gone into heaven to be our High Priest, continually offering before God His Father the sacrifice of His Body and Blood. It so happens that this year it supplants the feast of St Anthony.

Also Thursday 13 June: Alpha@Greyfriars

Alpha is an opportunity to explore life and the Christian faith in a friendly, open, and informal environment. Each session includes food, a short talk, and a discussion where you can share your thoughts. This week the question is, 'Why and How Should I Read the Bible?' Sunday 16 June: Day for Life

Day for Life is the day in the Church's year dedicated to raising awareness about the meaning and value of human life at every stage and in every condition. The Church

teaches that life is to be nurtured from conception to natural death (www.dayforlife.org/). At the Sunday Masses there will be a second collection to assist the work of the Anscombe Bioethics Centre and other life-related activities supported by the Church.

Sunday 23 June: Corpus Christi Procession

This year's procession will take place on Sunday 23 June, setting off from the Oratory at 2:30pm, stopping at Blackfriars, and then moving on to the Oxford University Chaplaincy for Benediction, finishing around 4pm, after which refreshments will be available in the chaplaincy. Everyone is welcome, but especially First Communicants in their finery and bearing petals to strew before Our Lord. And if there are any parishioners willing to act as Stewards for the occasion please meet in the Guild Room at the Oratory no later than 2pm, bringing their own yellow high-vis jackets if at all possible.

Wednesday 26 June: CAFOD action against climate change

Our climate is in crisis. The pace of change is too slow. It is time to say 'Enough.'
