### **Holy Communion for the Housebound**

Often, as we get older, we are not always able to attend Mass and need to receive the Sacrament at home. The priest or a eucharistic minister normally takes Holy Communion to the housebound at times when it is convenient. Please let Br. Paul know if you or a loved one cannot attend Mass, and he will arrange Holy Communion at home.

### **Gift Aid Scheme**

As a member of this parish, if you pay tax on income, be it in wages, salaries or pensions, it is easy to increase the value of your weekly parish donation to the collection at no additional cost to yourself. In the 2018-19 tax year, the benefit to the parish in recovered tax from the Gift Aid scheme was over £4200. So, if you haven't yet signed up for the scheme, please consider doing so.
