Monday 12 August: Legion of Mary

Thursday 15 August: Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

When the Mother of Jesus was taken body and soul into heaven, it was the culmination of all the wonderful things that God did with her. *It is celebrated as a Holy Day of Obligation*, so there will be two Masses, one at 7.30am and one at 7.30pm.

Also Thursday 15 August: Day of Prayer for Vocations

In Newman's Chapel at Littlemore, from 1.30pm to 7pm, there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, concluding with Benediction and Vespers, to pray for vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life, and for an increase in awareness of the vocation of all within the Church.

Friday 16 August: Funeral of Adelina Hall

The Requiem Mass for Adelina, who died on 19 July, will be at 10am, followed by burial at Botley cemetery. May the Lord grant her eternal peace.
