

After all the Sunday Masses, there will be opportunity to buy from a range of items – rosaries, crosses, cribs, and religious statues – produced by Christians in the Holy Land. *The Good Shepherd Company* are from Bethlehem, but are now based in Nottingham. They work alongside the St. Vincent De Paul Society for orphans and elderly in the Holy Land. Their goal is to support and help the Christian families in the Holy Land to stay at work as olivewood carving is one of the most important sources of income for them.
