## **Church Cleaning:**

## **Monday 21 October: Legion of Mary**

The Legion of Mary is a small group of ordinary Catholics who gather to pray and to organize works of mercy. Come to the door of the sacristy (at the side of the church) at 7.30pm.

## **Tuesday 22 October: Bible Study**

After a long break, the twice-a-month Bible study is back. We will be going through the book of Genesis. This first session will be an overview of the first 11 chapters, in preparation for looking at them in more detail during the following weeks. No theological training is necessary and anyone is welcome. We meet 7.30-8.30pm in the church hall.

## **Wednesday 23 October: Funeral of Paul Carroll**

Paul did a lot for this church in his time. He made the consecration crosses and candleholders, and restored the whole of the Divini Pastoris Mater Chapel and the statues in the Lady and Sacred Heart Chapels. He made an extension for the choir loft railing and French polished the old altar reredos now in the Baptistry. He also made the tabernacle for the former friars' chapel and some of the high-backed benches in that chapel (those benches are now in the hall). But many parishioners will remember him as the keeper of the fire at the Easter Vigils and as the man barbecuing away at parish fetes.

Paul will be laid to rest in Botley cemetery at 1.30pm, followed by a 3.30pm service at St Mary's in Iffley. May he rest in peace and may the Lord console his family.

## **Also Wednesday 23 October: Youth Alpha Oxford**

An Alpha course aimed particularly at ages 12-18, 6.30-8.30pm. Alpha is an

introduction to Christianity involving food, videos, and discussion. This week's main question is, 'How and Why do I Pray?'

## **Also Wednesday 23 October: Practical Action**

7.30pm-9pm, we will have a presentation about the charity *Practical Action*. Sarah Edwards will outline the work of the organisation and answer questions. *Practical Action* is an international charity, which puts ingenious ideas to work so people in poverty can change their world; ideas like pumping drinking water from underground rivers with solar power, building stoves that use less fuel and create less pollution, and creating floating gardens in areas prone to flooding. Founded by Fritz Schumacher, the refugee economist who wrote the ground-breaking book 'Small is Beautiful', *Practical Action* has spent 60 years partnering communities in Africa, Asia and South America, helping them to change their world for the better.
