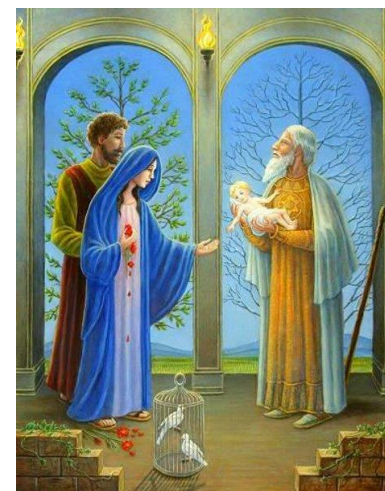

1st Reading: Malachi 3:1-4

Response: **Who is the king of glory? It is the Lord.**

2nd Reading: Hebrews 2:14-18

Gospel: Luke 2:22-40

Entrance Antiphon: Your merciful love, O God, we have received in the midst of your temple. Your praise, O God, like your name, reaches the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with saving justice.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! The light to enlighten the Gentiles and give glory to Israel, your people. Alleluia!

Communion Antiphon: My eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples.

Sunday 2 February: Feast of the Presentation of the Lord

Traditionally known as Candlemas, this feast features a blessing of candles followed by a candlelit procession. This commemorates the day when the baby Jesus was brought to the Temple and the old prophet Simeon welcomed Him as “a light of revelation to the Gentiles”. You may wish to bring your own candles to be blessed along with the church candles.

Because Jesus was presented at the Temple to consecrate Him to God, today is also the Day of Prayer for Consecrated Life.

Morning Mass

Morning Mass is celebrated on every weekday (Monday–Friday at 7.30am & Saturday at 8am) in the Friary Chapel. For morning Mass, please enter via the main door of the Friary at 182 Iffley Road. Once in the porch, follow the sign to the Chapel.

Preparing for Mass—Fasting

The Church has a discipline of a Eucharistic Fast. For Catholics this means an obligation to abstain from all food and drink (except water) for one hour prior to Communion. This minimal requirement serves to remind us that the Eucharistic Banquet is an event to prepare for. Those who are elderly or sick are exempt from this law, especially when the Eucharist is brought to them.

IF YOU GO INTO HOSPITAL

Catholics in hospital are unlikely to receive an automatic visit from the Catholic Chaplain. If someone is taken to hospital, please let the Friary know or ask the staff on the ward to contact the Catholic Chaplain so that the patient may receive Holy Communion and/or the Sacrament of the Sick.

Weddings 2020

If you are planning to get married in 2020, you should contact Br. Paul as soon as possible to make the necessary arrangements. The Diocese requires at least six months notice, which is essential in cases where the marriage is taking place abroad, when a good deal of administrative work has to be completed. Marriage preparation is also required, whether or not both partners are Catholic.
