Monday 2 March: Legion of Mary (7.30pm)

Wednesday 4 March: YouChat

A weekly gathering for young people (ages 12–18) involving food, fun, and faith-filled conversation. We are going through YOUCAT, the Catholic catechism for young people. No need to book—just turn up at 6.30pm in the church hall.

Monday 9 March: Funeral of Rose Dunne RIP

A long-term parishioner of Greyfriars, Rose lived the last couple of years at Isis Care Home. She died on 5 February, aged 91 years. Her Requiem Mass will be at 11am.

Also Monday 9 March: Youth Ministry Training Programme

From 7pm to 9pm, on five consecutive Mondays, finishing on 6 April, the Birmingham Catholic Youth Service (BCYS) will host ‘Bethsaida’, a weekly training programme on youth ministry at Our Lady Help of Christians (OX4 2ND). The Catholic parishes of Oxford are all joining in a 3-week outreach to local people.
