

1st Reading: Proverbs 31:10-13,19-20,30-31

Response: **O blessed are those who fear the Lord.**

2nd Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6

Gospel: Matthew 25:14-30

Entrance Antiphon: The Lord said: I think thoughts of peace and not of affliction. You will call upon me, and I will answer you, and I will lead back your captives from every place.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Even if you have to die, says the Lord, keep faithful, and I will give you the crown of life. Alleluia!

Communion Antiphon: To be near God is my happiness, to place my hope in God the Lord.

Lockdown

Despite the objections of our bishops and other religious leaders, this second national lockdown includes a ban on communal worship. We are allowed, however, to open the church for private prayer. So please do pay a visit if you want to pray in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.
